Description

Campanula glomerata, also known as Clustered Bellflower, is an herbaceous perennial easily grown in moist, well-drained soils. It produces clusters of violet blue to deep purple flowers which bloom June to July but could continue blooming into the summer with prompt pruning. The flowers are great for cuttings and also attracting butterflies, hummingbirds and other pollinators. These plants spread via rhizomes which can make them somewhat invasive. They should be divided every 3 to 5 years to encourage continued heartiness and shaping. They are not subject to any serious insects or diseases but could attract the occasional snail or slug. They require regular moisture and are deer tolerant.
