 Description

Geranium maculatum, also known as wild geranium, spotted geranium and wood geranium, grows in average moist soils in full sun to part shade. These can be found in woodland areas as well as roadside borders. The produce pale-pink, deep pink or lilac blooms in April and May. Since they do not usually rebloom, deadheading can be an unnecessary chore. The foliage is a deep green but may yellow in hot summers when the soil is dry. When this occurs, it is a good time to lightly shear and reshape the plant. Wild geranium attracts butterflies and is tolerant of rabbits and deer. It has no serious insect or disease problems.
