 Description

Nipponanthemum nipponicum, also known as Nippon Daisy and Montauk Daisy is an herbaceous perennial best planted in dryer soils with full sun. Light shade may be desirable in hotter climates. Blooms appear July through August of white rays with a green center disc. The leaves are thick, oblong, coarsely-toothed, glossy dark green. It is propagated by dividing clumps every 2-3 years to promote vigor. Also, remove spent flower heads to promote additional blooms. This daisy is a long lasting fresh cut flower. It attracts butterflies and is tolerant of drought. There are no serious insect or disease problems.
