

YELLOW TWIG DOGWOOD CORNUS SERICEA 'FLAVIRAMEA'

Description

This plant is an upright- spreading, suckering shrub and is native to much of North America where it is found growing in wet swampy areas, wetland margins or along lakes and rivers. Fruit is quite attractive to birds. 'Flaviramea' is a compact shrub with a spreading stoloniferous habit. The outstanding ornamental feature is its bright yellow winter stems. Best grown in organically rich, fertile, consistently moist soils; tolerant of a wide range of soils, including swamp conditions. This shrub is susceptible to leaf and twig blights, canker, and leaf spots. Scale, leaf miners and bagworms are occasional insect pests. It is excellent massed, in borders, or as a specimen. It is effective as a property line screen and in naturalized plantings in moist soils where plants can be allowed to spread and form thickets.
