 Description

Aruncus dioicus, also known as Goat's Beard, is an herbaceous perennial grown in moist, well-drained soils. It produces blooms in April and May of tiny cream-colored flowers that rise above the foliage making a bold visual statement where they are grown. Removing faded flower stalks will not promote new growth and some prefer the look of dried stems rising over the foliage. Foliage will decline if the soil is allowed to dry out. These make a great addition to rain gardens and other moist landscapes. They are also tolerant of rabbits. Goat's Beard is susceptible to leaf spot but does not have any serious insect or disease problems.
