Description

Campanula poscharskyana, also known as Serbian Bellflower or Trailing Bellflower, is a low growing herbaceous perennial easily grown in moist, well-drained soils. It is planted popularly as edging for paths, rock gardens and border fronts. They are semi-evergreen with medium green foliage. They produce showy lavender-blue star-shaped flowers blooming in May and June. They prefer shade during the hot summers and do not thrive well in climates with night temperatures above 70 degrees F. These plants spread quickly from root crowns but the stems can be easily trimmed to control growth and spread. They are not subject to any serious insects or diseases but could attract the occasional snail or slug. They require regular moisture and are deer tolerant.
