 Description

Coreopsis lanceolata, also known as Lanceleaf Coreopsis and Lanceleaf Tickseed (because of the resemblance of the seeds to ticks) grows very well in dry soils as well as shallow and rocky soils which can be hard on other plants. It is also tolerant of heat and humidity. In May through July it produces blooms of single, daisy-like showy yellow flowers 1 – 2" in size. It is an aggressive spreading plant which can be kept in check by deadheading in the summer to prevent self-seeding. If allowed to self-seed, it will produce natural large colonies that can be divided every 2-3 years, especially when used as borders. Lanceleaf Coreopsis attracts butterflies and is resistant to deer. It is used in wildflower gardens as well as found in fields and meadows. There are many excellent cultivars of this species available commercially.
