 Description

Hemerocallis, a genus of 15 species of daylily, is easily grown in average, medium, well-drained soil in full sun to partial shade. Its flowers can be bell or trumpet-shaped, rising to up to 12". Flowers are fragrant and bloom for only 1 to 2 days but each plant will continuously produce new flowers presenting a colorful addition to any garden. They are very adaptable perennials, often grown in clumps or masses. Deadhead spent flowers daily for neatness and divide every 3 to 4 years to maintain vigor. 'Stella de Oro' is a commercial hybrid that has 2.75" diameter yellow, ruffled-edged blooms, and is classified as a miniature. One of the most popular daylilies in cultivation because of its compact size, vigorous growth, profuse and long bloom periods. Daylilies have no known diseases and are virtually pest-free, though mites and thrips may appear occasionally. Daylily rust may be problematic in some areas. Rabbits avoid daylilies but butterflies love them.
