

DWARF SOLOMON'S SEAL *Polygonatum humile*

Description

Polygonatum humile, also known as Dwarf Solomon's Seal, is an herbaceous perennial that slowly spreads through rhizomes that form creeping colonies. It blooms May and June with tubular greenish-white flowers that turn to ¼" blue-black berries that hang down from its axils. It is an easy grower that performs best in moist, humus-rich soils in part shade although it can tolerate heavy shade. Its leaves are veined, oval-shaped about 3" long. It is found in forests and grassy slopes and is used for ground cover and in rain gardens and has no serious insect or disease problems.
